I. Executive Summary: 2024 Community Survey

The Lynchburg Police Department (LPD) conducted its biennial Community Survey from December 1, 2024, to January 3, 2025, using the online survey platform SurveyMonkey. The department informed the community about this survey through social media and local media outlets. The LPD received 382 responses, down from the 788 responses received in 2022. The 2020 Lynchburg Police Department Community Survey generated 355 responses, the 2018 survey had 86 responses, and the 2015 survey had 184 responses.

The 2024 survey included 22 questions, which were the same 22 questions as in the 2022 survey. The goal was to gauge the department's progress by comparing answers to the same questions across different years. The LPD will use the responses provided in this survey to inform the department's continued efforts to deliver the best service possible to Lynchburg's residents and visitors.

The majority (24%) of respondents to the 2024 survey were 55 years or older, and 57% were female. Overall, the majority of respondents (90%) stated they were residents of the City of Lynchburg. Respondents lived in all areas of the city and were fairly evenly distributed among Wards I, II, III, and IV.

The majority (38%) of respondents rated the quality of police service in Lynchburg as "Good," up from 34% in the 2022 survey. Additionally, 53% said the LPD is responsive to "A Lot" and "To a Great Extent" of the concerns of the community, up from 46% in the 2022 survey. More than 56% of respondents said they trust their local law enforcement "A Lot" or "To a Great Extent."

In response to questions about developing relationships with community members, communicating with community members, and working with community members to solve problems, the majority of respondents said the LPD performs these tasks "A Lot." This is an improvement from the "Somewhat" responses in the 2022 survey. When asked to what extent the Lynchburg Police Department regularly communicates with community members, a slight majority (29%) answered "Somewhat," with 28% saying the department communicates via these mediums "A Lot."

Most respondents who had contact with an LPD Officer or Professional Staff over the past two years said the LPD employee explained themselves and their actions "To a Great Extent," although the majority (31%) of respondents answered "N/A."

The vast majority (58%) of respondents also stated that they were treated with dignity and respect. Most respondents (29%) said that the LPD shows "A Lot" of concern for community members, but when combined with "To a Great Extent," that number reaches 54%.




Community Survey Responses - 2024

Approximately 72% of respondents to the 2024 survey said they feel their neighborhood is safe, up from 65% in the 2022 survey. Roughly 43% say they feel "Safe" to "Very Safe" walking alone in their neighborhood at night. The top three most serious problems noted by respondents were "larceny/theft" (35%), "other" (31%), and "drugs" (31%). The most common issue noted by respondents in their neighborhoods was speeding (58%).


The survey concluded with an open-ended question asking individuals to provide feedback on what the department needs to do differently. The LPD received 240 responses, including both constructive criticism and positive feedback. The predominant themes were: more enforcement of laws; increased officer presence; addressing speeding and reckless driving; and expressions of support.



Q1 Are you a resident of The City of Lynchburg?







Q2 What is your age?







Q3 What is your gender?







Q4 Do you own or rent your home?







Q5 In which Ward do you live? You can find your Ward here: Ward Map







Q6 How would you rate the quality of police service in your community?







Q7 To what extent is the Lynchburg Police Department responsive to the concerns of the community?







Q8 To what extent do you trust your law enforcement?







Q9 To what extent does the Lynchburg Police Department develop relationships with community members (residents, organizations, and groups)?







Q10 To what extent does the Lynchburg Police Department regularly communicate with community members (website, emails, public meetings, events, social media)?







Q11 To what extent does the Lynchburg Police Department work together with community members to solve problems?







Q12 If you had contact with a Lynchburg Police Department officer or staff over the past two years, to what extent did they sufficiently explain their actions and procedures?







Q13 If you have had any contact with Lynchburg Police Department officers or staff over the past two years, were you treated professionally, with dignity and respect?







Q14 To what extent do Lynchburg Police officers and staff show concern for community members?







Q15 Do you feel your neighborhood is safe?








Q16 In your opinion, what are the top 3 most serious problems in your neighborhood?




Q17 Check each box that you feel is a problem in your neighborhood.







Q19 How safe do you feel walking alone in your neighborhood during the day?







Q20 How safe do you feel walking alone in your neighborhood at night?





Summary: The majority of answers provided fit into one of the following four categories.

1. Traffic & Public Safety

Pros

Community members appreciate quick response times to accidents.

Many acknowledge that LPD does a good job despite resource limitations.

Some citizens support the idea of increased patrols and stricter enforcement of traffic laws.

Cons

Speeding and reckless driving are major concerns, especially on roads like Enterprise Drive, Old Forest Road, and 501. Many feel that red-light running, distracted driving, and aggressive road behavior are not adequately enforced. Complaints that officers are not visible enough on main roads and in neighborhoods.

2. Crime & Law Enforcement Presence

Pros:

Some community members appreciate LPD's efforts in reducing crime and making arrests.

There is support for hiring more officers and providing better compensation to retain them.

Increased patrols and community policing efforts (like walking beats) are viewed positively.

Cons:

Concerns about unsolved murders and violent crimes not being adequately addressed.

Complaints of over-policing in some communities, while others feel ignored.

Issues with response times and lack of follow-up on reports of theft, break-ins, and vandalism.

3. Community Relations & Policing Approach

Pros:

Community engagement efforts, including neighborhood watch programs, are generally well received.

Some officers are praised for their professionalism and kindness in interactions with citizens.

There is support for more transparency and communication with the public.

Cons

Perceived racial bias and lack of understanding of issues in minority communities.

Some believe LPD officers can be overly aggressive or dismissive in their interactions.

Concerns that officers spend too much time enforcing minor infractions rather than focusing on major crimes.

4. Homelessness, Drug Issues & Neighborhood Concerns

Pros

Residents support addressing homelessness and drug issues with both law enforcement and community programs.

Calls for improved regulations on high-crime rental properties and increased accountability for landlords.

Requests for more resources to help mentally ill and drug-addicted individuals instead of just arresting them.

Cons:

Complaints that LPD focuses on moving homeless individuals rather than addressing root causes.

Allegations that certain areas, particularly low-income neighborhoods, are overlooked when it comes to crime prevention.

Concerns about the rise in drug activity, particularly in areas with vape shops and near schools.
